Scope and Severity is a system of rating the seriousness of deficiencies. A "deficiency" is a regulatory requirement that a survey finds not being met. Scope and Severity is a national system used by all state survey agencies and the Health Care Financing Administration when conducting nesting home Medicare and Medicaid certification surveys.

For each deficiency, the surveyor

determines the level of harm to the resident or resident(s) involved and the scope of the problems within the nursing home. The surveyor then assigns an alphabetical scope and severity value, A through L, to the deficiency. "A" is the least serious and "L" is the most serious rating. The scope and severity matric is an integral part of how nursing home scores are calculated in the scoring system.

What is Substandard Quality of Care?

Substandard Quality of Care is a technical regulatory term which means that one or more requirements under the federal regulations 42CFR 483.13 (resident behavior and facility practices), 42CFR 483.15 (quality of life), or 42CFR 483.25 (quality of care) were not met, to a degree constituting immediate jeopardy to resident health or safety, and a scope of pattern or widespread actual harm, or a widespread potential for more than minimal harm. A finding of substandard quality of care indicates that the nursing home was found to have had a significant deficiency (or deficiencies), which the home must address and correct quickly to protect the health and safety of residents. The Division specifies a maximum time frame for correction of the deficiencies.
